PROCLAMATION NO. 79-A

DECLARING WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 20, 1954, AS A SPECIAL PUBLIC
HOLIDAY IN THE PROVINCE OF LEYTE, INCLUDING ORMOG CITY.

WHEREAS, the twentieth day of October is of special
significance to the people of Leyte, being the anniversary
of the landing on the shores of said province of the United
States Armed Forces in their mission to liberate the country
from enemy occupation;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RAMON MAGSAYSAY, President of the
Philippines, by virtue of the powers vested in me by Section
30 of the Revised Administrative Code, do hereby declare
Wednesday, October 20, 1954, as a special public holiday in
the province of Leyte, including Ormoc City.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and
caused the seal of the Republic of the Philippines to be
affixed.
